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Dear Parent/Guardian

Protecting against HPV (human papillomavirus vaccine) infection and reducing the risk of cancer. HPV is now offered to all 12 to 13 year old boys and girls in school year 8

We are writing to tell you about the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine which has been offered to all girls in school year 8 for over ten years. From September 2019 the vaccine has also be offered to year 8 boys. This is because the evidence is clear that the HPV vaccine helps protect both boys and girls from HPV-related cancers.

The vaccine is given as two separate vaccinations given a year apart, the first in year 8 and the second in year 9. For further information about the HPV vaccination please visit -

The vaccination may be given in your child's school or in a community setting by experienced immunisation nurses, following all the latest Public Health guidance regarding PPE.

For this vaccination to take place we require a consent form for your child to be completed, this consent form will be valid for your child to receive both doses of the HPV vaccine.
